expected by the end of 2025, likely adding new hazard classes/categories. Once published, implementation timelines will be set – last grace period was 3 years.

Japan – Expanding SDS

Requirements: In parallel, Japan's authorities (MHLW) are moving to add 36 more chemicals to the mandatory SDS list.

- **Today:** Japan mandates SDSs for a specified list of substances.
- Recent proposal (late 2025): aims to include 36 more chemicals to the list.
- Keep an eye out for the final rule publication from Japan, expected by end of 2025. Enforcement expected April 2028.
- **List of 36 chemicals** adding to the mandatory SDS list.



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
